

Information for Authors

The IEEE TRANSACTIONS ON NUCLEAR SCIENCE is published bimonthly. Its scope includes all aspects of the theory and application of nuclear science and engineering. It includes instrumentation for the detection and measurement of ionizing radiation; particle accelerators and their controls; nuclear medicine and its application; effects of radiation on materials, components, and systems; reactor instrumentation and controls; and measurement of radiation in space.

Manuscripts considered for publication should report original contributions to the theories, experimental results, or applications of the fields listed above; although papers of a tutorial or historical nature will be considered. Recent findings of a noteworthy nature will be considered for the Correspondence section; these will ordinarily be shorter length papers, thus facilitating the review process. Submission of material will be construed as indicating that it has not been copyrighted, published, submitted, or presented elsewhere unless explicit notice to the contrary is given.

Contributed papers, as described above, may be submitted to the Editor at any time. Another type of paper is one which was originally presented at one of the regularly sponsored conferences of the Nuclear and Plasma Sciences Society, namely, the Conference on Nuclear and Space Radiation Effects (NSREC), Nuclear Science Symposium (NSS), Medical Imaging Conference (MIC), Symposium on Nuclear Power Systems (SNPS), and Conference on Real Time Computer Applications in Nuclear and Particle Physics (RT). For conference authors wishing to have their work considered for publication in the TRANSACTIONS, instructions for the submission of their papers will be provided by the program committee of the conference.

SUBMITTING THE ORIGINAL MANUSCRIPT

- 1) The IEEE TRANSACTIONS ON NUCLEAR SCIENCE has implemented a Web-based peer review process called Manuscript Central. Submit your manuscript to the Web site at <http://tns-ieee.manuscriptcentral.com/>. Detailed instructions for submitting a manuscript to this site are available from the Editor at p.dressendorfer@ieee.org.
- 2) It is the policy of the IEEE to own the copyright to the technical contributions it publishes on behalf of the interests of the IEEE, its authors, and their employers, and to facilitate the appropriate reuse of this material by others. To comply with the U.S. Copyright law, authors are required to sign an IEEE Copyright Form before publication. This form returns to authors and their employers full rights to reuse their material for their own purposes. A copy of the form can be found at <http://www.ieee.org/about/documentation/copyright/>. Authors are requested to make a copy of it and submit the form, properly signed, at the time of submission of their manuscripts.
- 3) At the time of submission, please notify the Editor of any special circumstances such as pending clearances or previous limited publications.
- 4) The abstract should be a short (about 200 words) description of the nature of the problem or topic being discussed and the scope of its treatment: What is the author's unique approach or important contribution, and what is the solution, finding, conclusion, or principal result or application? (Fifty-word (or less) abstracts should accompany Correspondence items.)
- 5) Organization of material: The longest section of the paper should be that treating the author's significant contribution, with supporting or peripheral material condensed in shorter sections. This gives proper emphasis to the main subject of the paper and a high information density to the overall structure. The text should be

succinct: not longer than 20 double-spaced typewritten pages if possible.

- 6) All illustrations and tables must be referred to in the text.
- 7) For the review copy, figures should be included in the electronic file submitted to Manuscript Central. (Note that for the final submission of material for a manuscript accepted for publication, the figures should be in separate files, as detailed in *Guidelines for Author-Supplied Electronic Text and Graphics* located at http://www.ieee.org/portal/cms_docs/pubs/transactions/eic-guide.pdf)
- 8) All references should be complete and in the following form: For a paper: Initials and last name(s) of author(s), title of paper, name of journal, volume, number, inclusive page numbers, month and year. For a book: Initials and last name(s) of author(s), and/or editor, book title, place of publication, publisher, year, chapter, or page numbers.
- 9) Use metric units, more specifically, the International System of Units. If custom or convenience dictates British-American units for specific uses, the metric equivalent should also be given in parentheses.
- 10) Use only standard symbols and abbreviations. Acronyms and abbreviations must be defined when first used in the text.
- 11) Avoid the use of trade and company names and proprietary terms whenever possible.
- 12) Include a complete mailing address for each author, along with telephone and fax numbers, and e-mail address. Identify the corresponding author for the paper. Notify the Editor if there is a change of address.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ILLUSTRATIONS

With the submission of materials for a final accepted manuscript, high-quality hardcopy figures will be required in addition to electronic files of these figures. (Information on the preparation of electronic files of the figures is available at http://www.ieee.org/portal/cms_docs/pubs/transactions/eic-guide.pdf). Figures and photos should be original proofs and not copies. Photos should be glossy prints with no screens.

- 1) All illustrations should be black on white paper, ink drawings, or good-quality computer-generated graphics with the original size not to exceed 22 × 28 cm (8 1/2 × 11 in). The image area should not require reduction in excess of a 5:1 ratio. Lettering should be large enough to remain legible after the size reduction.

On graphs, show only the coordinate axes or, at most, the major grid lines.

Photographs of high contrast on glossy paper are preferred.

SUBMITTING THE FINAL MANUSCRIPT

After the review process (which is done via the Manuscript Central website), authors of manuscripts accepted for publication will be provided with additional instructions for the final submission of their material for publication.
