INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

The JOURNAL OF LIGHTWAVE TECHNOLOGY is published monthly. It is comprised of original contributions covering work in all aspects of optical guided-wave science, technology, and engineering. Manuscripts are solicited that report original theoretical and/or experimental results that advance the technological base of guided-wave technology. Tutorial and review papers are by invitation only. Topics of interest include the following: fiber and cable technologies, active and passive guided-wave componentry (light sources, detectors, repeaters, switches, fiber sensors, etc.), integrated optics/optoelectronics, systems/subsystems, networks, switching, new applications, and unique field trials. System-oriented manuscripts should be concerned with systems that perform a function not previously available, out-perform previously established systems, or represent enhancements in the state of the art in general. Submission instructions: Manuscripts should be submitted online at http://leos-ieee.manuscriptcentral.com/. Manuscripts may be submitted in .pdf or Word for review purposes; however, after a paper is accepted, the files must be formatted according to the IEEE Production requirements (text and art are saved separately in approved applications). Please try to adhere to the accepted style of the JOURNAL as much as possible. Authors are reminded that revisions while the paper is under review are usually not allowed. Do not try to be overly fancy; you would be better off spending your time 'fine-tuning' the content and leaving the format to the publisher. Two-column format is preferred for estimating the page-length.

Please submit your paper for review at Manuscript Central with electronic files containing: 1) a cover letter stating that the paper includes new material that has not been previously published, 2) a file with the complete text and figures of the manuscript, 3) up to eight Index Words or Keywords (a list of approved terms may be obtained by e-mailing keywords@ieee.org), 4) references, which must include full titles and first and last page numbers of articles, 5) short biographies of all authors (photographs are optional), and 6) a completed copyright release form (which may be submitted online in the author-center). Submission inquiries and status requests may be sent to Doug Hargis, JLT Publications Coordinator (d.hargis@ieee.org).

Preparing accepted papers for production: Immediately after a manuscript has been accepted, the corresponding author must send Doug Hargis at the J-LT Editorial Office an e-mail, disk, or CD-ROM containing files in the required format: text saved separately, preferably in Word, Tex, or LaTex; figures and photos saved individually, in .eps, .ps, or .tif format.

The following is a list of general guidelines for submission of electronics media by prospective authors: 1) The operating system and word processing software used to produce your document should be noted on your disk, CD-ROM, or tape (e.g., DOS/WordPerfect). In the case of Unix media, the method of extraction (i.e., tar, bar, dump) should also be noted. 2) The disk/tape should be labeled with the file name(s) relating to the manuscript. 3) No program files should be included on the disk. 4) Package disks in such a way as to minimize possible damage in transit. 5) Include a flat ASCII version on the disk with the word-processed version, if possible.

While the list of processing programs acceptable is almost endless, there are preferred programs that, when used, enable the preservation of the greatest amounts of information. TeX and LaTeX are preferred. An IEEE LaTeX style file, IEEE Trans. Sty. is obtained by authors who e-mail a request to help@ep.ieee.org. The following points are important to remember when submitting electronic manuscripts (compuscripts) in TeX or LaTeX: 1) Include all macros (\def) that are required to produce your document. 2) IEEE JOURNAL style dictates a 21-pica (3.5-in.) column width. If mathematical phrases are produced with this in mind, they are apt to appear more aesthetically pleasing in the final version.

The IEEE will accept 1) any IBM-PC (or 100% compatible) disk format: 2.5-in/360k/1.2 MB-3.5-in/720k/1.44 MB (DS/DD, DS/HD, DS/QD, etc.); 2) Macintosh disk format (low and high density); 3) 0.25-in. magnetic tape cartridges (Unix: tar, bar, dump); 4) 3.5-in. floppy disk (Unix: tar, bar, dump); 5) 8-mm tape cartridges (Unix: tar, bar, dump). If in doubt, do not hesitate to inquire using help@ep.ieee.org.

Copyright: It is the policy of the IEEE to own the copyright to the technical contributions it publishes on behalf of the interest of the IEEE, its authors, and their employers, and to facilitate the appropriate reuse of this material by others. To comply with IEEE policy under the U.S. Copyright Law, authors are required to sign an IEEE copyright transfer form before publication. This form, a copy of which appears in each January issue of this JOURNAL, returns to authors and their employers full right to reuse their material for their own purposes. Page Charges: After a manuscript has been accepted for publication, the author's company or institution will be asked to pay page charges of \$110 per page to cover part of the cost of publication. In addition, overlength page charges of \$260 per page are mandatory for each page in excess of eight printed pages and are required for publication. Page charges (first eight pages only) for this JOURNAL are not obligatory, nor is their payment a prerequisite for publication. The author will receive 100 free reprints without covers if the charge is honored. Detailed instructions will accompany the galley proof.

Color Art Charges: There is no charge for printing figures in black and white. Production costs associated with color printing are \$1045 for setup plus \$125 per figure thereafter. Authors may choose to pay for color printing in the JOURNAL or avoid such charges by converting their figures to grayscale. The JOURNAL also offers authors the option of publishing figures in black and white in the printed edition while displaying color versions online at IEEE Xplore(TM) at no additional cost. Upon acceptance of the manuscript, the corresponding author must inform Doug Hargis at the J-LT Editorial Office (d.hargis@ieee.org) of the decision regarding publication of color figures in print and/or online. The author must submit figure and photo files in the appropriate format and resolution.
