## Housekeeping Details

The footnotes at the bottom of the first page of a contribution published in this journal have an importance of their own beyond the apparent inclusion of interesting data for the reader.

The *Date Received* is the date the original manuscript was received by an editor or any editorial office of the IEEE; *Revisions Received* and any other calendar data serves to expand upon the original date, and gives the history of the manuscript, and its release to the public. These dates, together with the actual date of mailing of the issue, are the basis for legal decisions concerned with the patentability of ideas, processes, or devices described therein.

*Author's Addresses* are the mailing addresses used by us in corresponding with the authors, and are used for mailing their complimentary copies. Any former affiliation information is also placed here.

*Indexing Data* In the event of a compound last name, the author is queried concerning how he/she wishes to be indexed; if normal rules do not apply, any variation is noted here for the use of indexers and librarians. (Example: Vander Stoep *may* be indexed under *V*; normal usage would be *S*.)

*Credit* lines to the sponsoring agency, or sponsoring committee, are included when not actually a portion of an Acknowledgment or either credit portion of the contribution itself.

*Copyright Clearance Center* codes are included so that copies made later can be credited to the proper journal. When copyright laws do not apply, or a variation from U.S. Copyright is necessary, notations to that effect are included.

*Presentation or Reprinted From* dates and information are given in detail, to enable all to know that this is not the journal of first appearance, and to give proper credit to the source of material.

*This data does not represent the views of - - - - but are those of the author* is self-explanatory.

There may be other notes appearing from time-to-time; the seven given here represent those usually appearing most frequently. All of this data is required to help complete our portion of the **Information System** of which we are a small portion.
