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INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

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Manuscripts in the two-column single-spaced format common for conference publication will not be accepted, as this format is unsuitable for peer review or for publication formatting.

The manuscript should be prepared in a single-column double-spaced format and include all figures, tables, captions, and references. Manuscript length must not exceed nine double-spaced pages, exclusive of the title page mentioned below. Longer manuscripts will not be entered into the review process. In PEL Letters, the final publication in the Letters is normally limited to three or fewer pages. Mandatory page charges will apply to final version pages four and above, and the authors must agree to pay any overlength page charges in advance of publication.

When submitting the paper for review, estimate the length of a paper using the following method:

- 1) Three (3) pages of text in single-column double-spaced format translate to approximately one page when published in the Letters.
- 2) Six (6) figures translate to approximately one page when published in the Letters. For the purpose of estimation, count as separate figures different parts of the same figure. For example, if Figure 1 has parts (a), (b), and (c), then for the purpose of estimating final paper length Figure 1 is estimated to take approximately one half of a final published page.

The first page should be a title page that contains the paper title, full first and last names of all authors (do not use an initial for the first name), author organizational affiliation as it should appear in the final version, and which of the authors is the corresponding author along with the corresponding author's title, name, postal address, voice telephone number, fax telephone number, and e-mail address. The title page should also indicate whether or not the paper has been presented at a conference and if so should specify the conference name, dates, and location. Paper titles should be selected for value to potential readers and researchers. As much as possible, please avoid extraneous words such as "new" or "novel," as they are not helpful in search processes. The context of power electronics is generally understood, and should not be necessary in the title, although this term is of value in the abstract to aid searches.

The title page must also contain an abstract of not more than 200 words. The abstract should not only indicate the subject and scope of the paper but also summarize the author's conclusion, so that the abstract itself will be a useful document in an information-retrieval system. Begin the main text of the paper on the second page. It is preferred that all figures, tables, and other materials be included within the submitted text to simplify the review process, although authors may elect to include figures and tables at the end of the manuscript if necessary. All illustrations, whether in color or in black and white, should be suitable for monochrome printing, as the readers will not generally have access to color printers.

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Figures and table captions should go on a separate page and also be in double-spaced single-column format.

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
