

Information for Authors

The IEEE TRANSACTIONS ON CIRCUITS AND SYSTEMS—II: EXPRESS BRIEFS (TCAS-II) is a monthly publication with a distribution of over 11 000 copies. Its primary goal is *rapid dissemination* of original, timely, and significant contributions to the research community. The field of interest covers ALL AREAS of interest to the IEEE Circuits and Systems Society and, thus, in particular, includes all areas covered by IEEE TRANSACTIONS ON CIRCUITS AND SYSTEMS—I: REGULAR PAPERS (TCAS-I) as well.

Targeted publication time is *four months* from the end of the month in which the manuscript is received, provided that the author responds immediately to all communications. In order to accomplish this, the outcome of the prompt review process will be binary: an accept, or a reject decision. Authors are strongly encouraged to submit well prepared manuscripts that are complete and ready for publication. Only minor modifications to accepted manuscripts, that do not warrant another review, are allowed upon indication of the Associate Editor handling the paper.

The papers are expected to contain new results, ideas, or innovations that advance significantly the state-of-the-art circuits and systems. Submission of a contribution is taken to manifest the fact that the submission has not been submitted, accepted, published, or copyrighted elsewhere. However, since the intent is quick announcement of new results, more detailed versions of manuscripts submitted to or accepted by this TRANSACTIONS may also appear elsewhere *later*.

Specific topics to be covered include, but are not limited to the following: general theory of circuits and systems; neural networks, CNNs; nonlinear circuits and systems, chaos and bifurcations; power electronics and systems; numerical, graphical and symbolic computational methods; adaptive, blind and statistical signal processing and learning paradigms; multimedia signal processing; multidimensional signals and systems; wavelets and filter banks; (wireless) communication and sensors networks; analog, digital, mixed-mode and RF circuits; devices, circuits, architectures and system-on-chips for silicon as well as emerging technologies, e.g., MEMS, optoelectronics, quantum and nanoelectronics; biologically motivated circuits devices and associated computing paradigms.

Manuscript Length: Papers submitted to TCAS-II are meant to be no more than 5 pages in length in the two-column TRANSACTIONS format. Since this page limit is to be strictly followed, the authors are encouraged to use the IEEE style files, see the webpage:

for preparation of the manuscript.

A. Submission of a Paper: All papers must be submitted electronically in pdf or postscript format. To submit your paper electronically:

- 1) Go to <http://tcas2.polito.it>
- 2) You need to register by entering your information if you are not already registered in the database. In this case, you will be asked to fill out a form with your name, address, e-mail address, etc. You will also be asked to provide a password.
- 3) Fill out the submission form and submit. This will add a record to the submission database and begin the submission process.
- 4) You will receive a submission feedback page and a chance to upload your manuscript. You may upload a postscript or pdf file by using the browse button to search your hard drive.
- 5) If you get the "Thank you" page, your file has been submitted along with the information which describes it. If the editorial staff has trouble printing the file, you will be informed about this via e-mail.

B. Style for Submission of Manuscript:

- 1) Provide an informative 100- to 250-word abstract, at the head of the manuscript.
- 2) Provide a separate double-spaced sheet listing all footnotes, beginning with "Manuscript received _____" and "Affiliation of author including e-mail address" and continuing with numbered footnotes. Acknowledgment of financial support is often placed at the end of the footnote.
- 3) References may appear as numbered footnotes, or in a separate bibliography at the end of the paper, with items referred to by numerals in

square brackets, e.g., [12]. In either case, references should be complete and in IEEE style:

- a) *Style for papers:* Author, first initials followed by last name, title, volume, inclusive page numbers, month, and year.
 - b) *Style for books:* Author, title, location and publisher, year, chapter or page number (if desired).
- 4) Provide a separate sheet listing all figure captions, in proper style for the typesetter, e.g., Fig. 6. The final wide-band amplifier design.

C. Guidelines for Submission of Graphics: All charts, graphs, tables, or photographs may be submitted electronically, in TIFF, PS, or EPS formats; graphics submitted in other formats may be rejected and will need to be scanned. Therefore, it is important to follow our electronic guidelines. Further details may be obtained at:

Graphics should be in black and white, unless color is specifically requested. Authors must supply good clean sharp proofs of all figures and photographs, in the event the electronic files are not acceptable and need to be scanned. Laser prints are not acceptable in place of original photographs or where grayscale images are involved, as the print quality will be substandard. Font sizes for supplied graphics must be legible when the drawing is reduced to one column (3-7/16 inches or 36.612 mm) or two-column width (7-1/4 inches or 184.15 mm) or as much as a 4:1 reduction from the original. All original material should not be larger than 8-1/2 × 11 inches. Avoid sizing figures less than one column wide, as extreme enlargements may distort your images.

D. Page Charges: After a manuscript has been accepted for publication, the author's institution will be approached with a request to pay a charge of \$110 per page to cover part of the cost of publication. If the page charge is honored, the author will receive 100 free reprints (without covers). Color photos judged to be essential to demonstrate the results of a paper may be printed in color, but will incur extra cost on the author. Detailed instructions will accompany the page proofs.

E. Copyright: It is the policy of the IEEE to own the copyright to the technical contributions it publishes. To comply with IEEE copyright policy, authors are required to sign an IEEE Copyright Form before publication. The form is provided upon approval of the manuscript. Authors must submit a signed copy of this form with their approved manuscript. The copyright form is also available online at: <http://www.ieee.org/copyright/cfrmlink.htm>.

F. Electronic Form of Final Manuscript: For the final printed production of the manuscript, the author will need to provide a disk (3-1/2", zip, or CD-ROM) and two paper copies of the peer-approved version. Please be certain that changes made to the paper version are incorporated into your disk version and include an ASCII version of the file. Note the operating system (DOS, MAC, UNIX, etc.) and the software used on the label of the disk. Check that your files are complete including: abstract, text, references, footnotes, biographies, and figure captions. IEEE can process most commercial software, but not page layout programs (i.e., FrameMaker, Quark, Ventura). Do not send PostScript files of text. The preferred programs are TEX, LaTeX, and Word (use standard macros). At IEEE, LaTeX style files can be obtained at:
